CAMPUS SECURITY AND SAFETY POLICY

Bay Area Medical Academy is committed to assisting all members of the community in providing for their safety and security. Being situated within the city of San Francisco, Bay Area Medical Academy shares many of the same interests and concerns as the city, one of which is providing a safe environment for its students, faculty, and staff. As safety and security is everyone's responsibility, your actions, behaviors and responses can significantly reduce your risk of personal harm. At Bay Area Medical Academy, we understand the concern everyone has about campus safety. Our desire is for students, faculty and staff to enjoy their academic experience free from threats to their safety or well-being. The purpose of this publication is to share with you information relating to the safety and security of campus facilities, campus crime statistics, campus substance abuse policies, campus sexual assault policies, and timely warnings in compliance with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act.

Location: The campus of Bay Area Medical Academy occupies approximately 4,700 square feet in the building located at 530 Bush Street, San Francisco, California. Bay Area Medical Academy controls areas on the 2nd and 3rd floor of the building. The building is one of several structures next to Chinatown Gate. Bay Area Medical Academy has a satellite classroom location located at 84 W Santa Clara Street, Suite 400. For purposes of Clery Act data collection and reporting, the following definitions apply:

Campus: Areas of buildings which are leased, owned or controlled by Bay Area Medical Academy, including any classrooms, administrative offices, faculty offices, along with any hallways, elevators, lavatories, storage areas, parking lot or other areas used exclusively by Bay Area Medical Academy staff, faculty or students.

Non-Campus Property: All other areas of campus buildings that is not otherwise included in the definition of "campus" (above), including any hallways, elevators or outdoor areas owned or controlled by the building/development owners and routinely used by Bay Area Medical Academy's students. These areas are considered part of the "campus" for the purposes of the statistics above.

JEANNE CLERY DISCLOSURE OF CAMPUS SECURITY POLICY

The Jeanne Clery Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act of 1990 (Clery Act) requires colleges and schools to provide students and applicants a detailed report of crime statistics for the prior three years. The Clery Act is a federal statute codified at 20 U.S.C. § 1092(f), with implementing regulations in the U.S. Code of Federal Regulations at 34 C.F.R. 668.46.

CAMPUS CRIME REPORTING POLICY

Bay Area Medical Academy encourages all students and employees to be responsible for their own security and the security of others. The school does not employ campus security officials. However, there is a security officer in the main lobby of the San Francisco campus at 530 Bust Street. The security of the campus is the direct responsibility of each employee and the campus administrator. These individuals DO NOT have the authority to make an arrest. All individuals are requested to report immediately any known criminal offense or other emergency occurring on the campus to the school administration. All individuals are encouraged to promptly report all crimes to appropriate law enforcement agencies. The campus administrator will report all known criminal offenses to local law enforcement authorities upon receiving the information of any knowledge of a criminal offense. No student will have access to campus facilities at any time unless supervised by a staff member.

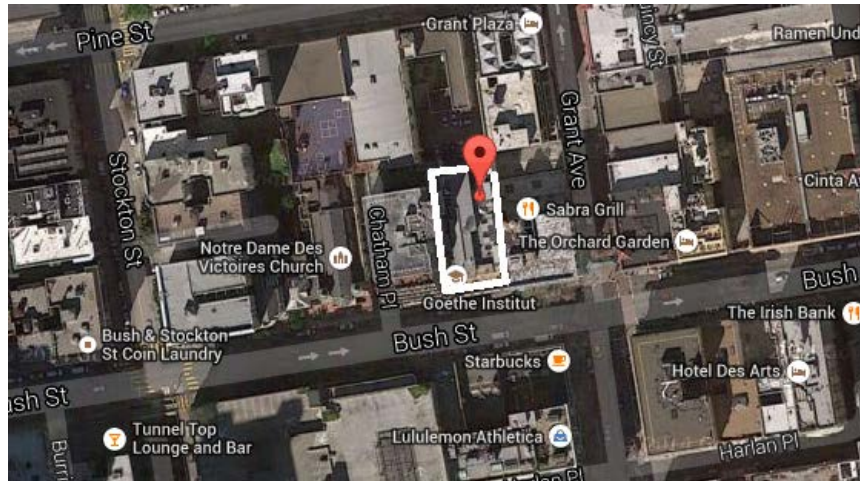
Any off campus events which are sponsored by the school are supervised by campus employees. The supervising staff member will monitor and report any criminal activity at such events to local law enforcement authorities.

Each year prior to October 1, the Bay Area Medical Academy prepares an annual security report to comply with the Jeanne Clearly Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act. The Clery Act (originally known as the Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act), signed in 1990, requires all colleges and universities that participate in federal financial aid programs to keep and disclose information about crime on and near their respective campuses.

2014-2016 CRIME STATISTICS

The following statistics are in accordance with definitions used in the Uniform Crime Reporting System of the Department of Justice, FBI, as modified by the Hate Crime Statistics Act. The data includes all crimes reported to the police. If a crime has occurred but has not been reported, it cannot be reflected in the following statistics. For this reason, Bay Area Medical Academy encourages everyone to report all crimes to their designated Instructor or the Director. The Bay Area Medical Academy expressly reserves the right to modify or to adopt additional campus policies and procedures relating to campus safety, at any time without notice.

Emergency Safety

Students are expected to promptly evacuate the building whenever a fire alarm sounds and to observe all fire/emergency guidelines. Misuse or damage to fire/emergency equipment (such as fire pull boxes, fire extinguishers) is strictly prohibited and will result in judicial or criminal action. Tampering with or disabling fire equipment is a felony in the state of California.

The San Francisco Fire Department will fine students found responsible for tampering with fire safety equipment and causing false alarms in the amount of \$100 to \$500

DEFINITIONS OF RESEARCHED CRIMES

- I. **Aggravated assault**- an attempt to cause serious bodily injury to another or to cause serious bodily injury purposely, knowingly or recklessly, with an extreme indifference to the value of human life
- II. **Arson**- the criminal act of deliberately setting fire to property.
- III. **Bomb Threat**- as a threat, usually verbal or written, to detonate an explosive or incendiary device to cause property damage, death, or injuries, whether or not such a device actually exists
- IV. **Burglary**- entry into a building illegally with intent to commit a crime, especially theft.
- V. **Disturbance**- the interruption of a settled and peaceful condition.
- VI. **Drug Abuse Violation**- unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs
- VII. **Hate Crimes**- a crime motivated by racial, sexual, or other prejudice, typically one involving violence.
- VIII. **Intimidation**- the action of intimidating someone, or the state of being intimidated.
- IX. **Larceny Theft**- trespassory taking (caption) and carrying away (asportation, removal) of the tangible personal property of another with the intent to deprive him or her of its possession permanently.
- X. **Liquor Law Violation**- The violation of State laws prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transporting, furnishing, and possessing intoxicating liquor.
- XI. **Menacing**- suggesting the presence of danger; threatening.
- XII. **Motor Vehicle Theft**- the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle
- XIII. **Murder**- the unlawful premeditated killing of one human being by another.
- XIV. **Negligent Manslaughter**- usually refers to an unintentional killing that results from recklessness or criminal negligence, or from an unlawful act that is a misdemeanor or low-level felony (such as DUI)
- XV. **Non-Negligent Manslaughter**- The willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another. As a general rule, any death caused by injuries received in a fight, argument, quarrel, assault, or commission of a crime is classified as Murder and Nonnegligent Manslaughter (1a).
- XVI. **Reckless Homicide**- Involuntary manslaughter often refers to unintentional homicide from criminally negligent or reckless conduct. It can also refer to an unintentional killing through commission of a crime other than a felony.
- XVII. **Robbery**- the action of robbing a person or place.
- XVIII. **Sex Offense: Forcible**- Any sexual act directed against another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent.
- XIX. **Sex Offense: Non-Forcible**- Unlawful, non-forcible sexual intercourse.
- XX. **Simple Assault**- someone attempts to cause or intentionally, knowingly or recklessly causes bodily injury to another; negligently causes bodily injury to another with a deadly weapon or attempts by physical menace to put another in fear of eminent serious bodily injury.
- XXI. **Terrorist Threatening**- a declaration of intent to commit a crime of violence against another with the intent of threatening a person, building, facility, or public or private habitat.
- XXII. **Theft**- the action or crime of stealing.
- XXIII. **Trespassing**- enter the owner's land or property without permission.
- XXIV. **Vandalism**- action involving deliberate destruction of or damage to public or private property
- XXV. **Wanton Endangerment**- the first degree is defined as when person. under circumstances manifesting extreme indifference to the value of human life
- XXVI. **Weapons Possession**- is the state of intentionally exercising control toward a weapon
